Northamptonshire is in the very heart of England and offers something for everybody.

With excellent road and rail links it's easy to find your way to the county often described as the Rose of the Shires. Here you can choose to step into the traditional rural lifestyle typified by Northamptonshire's numerous pretty villages with their thatched cottages and quaint pubs, country lanes and parish churches. Or at the other end of the spectrum, Northamptonshire offers many modern attractions and facilities, and holds the accolade of hosting the thrilling Formula One Grand Prix at Silverstone.

Northamptonshire is home to some of the most beautiful countryside in England. There are miles of walks, beautiful country parks, and substantial areas of ancient woodland just waiting to be explored. Miles of cycle paths follow the landscape of the Brampton Valley Way. Rockingham Castle perches on its hilltop with views stretching to Rutland Water. Stately homes and ancestral seats, including that of the Spencer family at Althorp, are all part of the local heritage. The network of canals and waterways that interweave the county through the Nene Valley are perfect for exploring.

In and around the main market towns, there are excellent leisure facilities with great shops, out of town retail and leisure complexes, restaurants, museums, galleries, theatres and cinemas, health clubs and spas, and a thriving nightlife for anyone with the energy.

Local sporting highlights include international venues at Silverstone and Santa Pod, the revered Saints rugby team at Franklins Gardens, football league teams and first-class county cricket. Enjoy spectacular golf courses, equestrian and country pursuits, and excellent water sports.

It's known for its affordability compared to London, good transport links both to London and Birmingham, and a blend of town life with beautiful surrounding countryside to explore. The town has a thriving community including the University Campus, a range of amenities, and a strong history: there is a vibrant cultural centre with independent shops, restaurants and bars, a gallery and museum in town centre and one in Abington Park, lots of stately homes and two theatres, cinemas, The Cobblers Football team, Saints Rugby and the County Cricket, if you like to watch sports. There are events in the town centre such as the balloon and beer festival.

Living in Corby //

Corby is a thriving town located in the heart of the UK.

There are family-friendly areas such as Cottingham and Oakley Vale, while another parts boast the tranquillity of surrounding villages with Rockingham Castle, Rockingham Forest and the East Carlton Country Park. The town is well-connected, with good bus services and train routes to London. Coupled with the competitive cost of housing, education is well regarded, providing highly-rated primary and secondary schools. Corby offers a good range of options for shopping, from high street brands to local independent stores and cultural experiences in The Cube. It's also close to Market Harborough, Stamford, and Oundle, all of which have lively markets on a regular basis.

Nestled in the scenic county of Northamptonshire, on the picturesque north side of the River Nene, Wellingborough not only boasts excellent transport links but also features house prices below the national average.
